



Hybrid Wilderness First Responder October 18-23, 2021

Location: Indian Creek Falls Group Site

Directions: Drive south from Moab on Highway (HWY) 191 for 40 miles or north from Monticello for 14.4 miles. Turn west on UT-211 and travel approximately 23 miles. Take the turn off to the north for Lockhart Basin / Hamburger Rock Campground. Travel approximately 2.2 miles and the destination will be on the west side of the road. It is located approximately 3 miles southeast of Canyonlands National Park and 17 miles northwest of Newspaper Rock.

LATITUDE/LONGITUDE: 38.2052778, -109.6338889

Camping: Camping is included and tents, vehicles and RVs are permitted for camping. Generator hours are from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am.

There is also a lot of dispersed camping along the road to Lockhart Basin before and after the Indian Creek Falls Group Site

Course starts: October 18th at 2:00 PM

Course ends: October 23rd at 11:30 AM

Class hours will be 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM on October 19th-22nd

Note:

Gusty winds are possible so always secure your tents and camping gear. Ravens, chipmunks, and other wildlife frequent the sites; never leave food out.

Spring/Summer thunderstorms can cause flash flooding and gusty winds; stay aware of current weather and dress accordingly.

Restrooms: On site (bring TP in case the campsite runs out)

Water: There are no showers, electricity, dump stations or drinking water at this site. You must bring your own drinking water and extra to wash dishes. We recommend a minimum of 5 gallons.

You can fill up your water containers for free at:

1. The spring on River Road (first pull out on right off HWY 128)
2. Gearhead Outdoor Store (471 Main St.)

Food: Food is not included. All course participants must provide their own food, cookstove and kitchen/cook set for the entire course.

1st Aid Kits: The instructors will have a major first aid kit for the group. We ask that you bring your own personal kit, medications, and sunscreen.

Reception: Cell reception is not good along the UT-211 corridor. It is more reliable as you get closer to Moab and Monticello.

Clothing: Depending on the time of year, days will be warm but nights can still be chilly. Bring warm clothes that you can layer, rain jacket & pants, down jacket, hat, gloves, sunglasses, shoes/boots in addition to flip-flops or sandals. Sun protective clothing is ideal since we will be in the sun for most of the day.

Course Gear: A camp chair for class is more comfortable than the ground and a sleeping pad for laying or kneeling on during scenarios, a headlamp, extra batteries, water bottle, note pad, pens, and a fine point sharpie.

NOTE: Check out the [Canyonlands-Needles Outpost](#) open March 1st to November 30th. It is approximately 3.5 miles from the junction of UT-211 and the Lockhart Basin road. Once you see the sign **Entering Canyonlands National Park**, the outpost will be 1 mile past that sign on the right. You will then see a sign for the Outpost on the right before their private road.

The outpost offers: pay WiFi, limited cell reception, pay showers, flush toilets, a well-stocked general store, unleaded fuel, propane, and other miscellaneous products. There is no potable water but they sell bottled water.

You do not need a National Park Pass, nor pay a park entry fee to access the outpost since it is 1.5 miles before the entrance of the park.

[Canyonlands National Park - Needle's Visitor Center](#) There is a free (outdoor) water refill station at the Visitor Center 1.5 miles away past the outpost. You will need either a park pass or pay an entry fee to get access to the visitor center.
